History of Hospital

Wallingford and District Cottage Hospital in Reading Road was opened in 1880. It became part of the NHS in 1948 under Reading and District Hospital Management Committee. Subsequently renamed Wallingford Community Hospital, it transferred to Oxfordshire Area Health Authority in 1974. At this time the site was expanded to include the first purpose built and designed community hospital in the Country. It was officially opened by Sir Keith Joseph in 1973. In 1982 it was managed by Oxfordshire Health Authority. Most recently it became part of the Oxfordshire Primary Care Trust but is now part of Oxford Health NHS Foundation Trust.

What does

Wallingford Hospital do?

Wallingford Hospital is a small community hospital providing vital physical and mental health services for the local population. There is a maternity unit, first aid unit, rehabilitation ward, along with day hospital services, a wide range of outpatient clinics, therapy services and two community mental health teams.

The ward, day services and out-patient clinics provide care following surgery or treatment at a general hospital. The hospital also acts as a bridge between hospital and home particularly for elderly patients who may need some assistance to help them regain their independence as they recover from an illness.



Who are we ?

The League of Friends is a voluntary run registered charity that supports the work of Wallingford Hospital by providing much needed equipment and comforts for the benefit of patients and staff.

The objective of the League of Friends is to improve the lives of patients and staff of the hospital and other local people who are sick, disabled or infirm and to generally support the charitable work of Wallingford Community Hospital.

How has the hospital benefited ?

Wallingford Hospital has benefited from donations and money raised. Some recent examples include:
